First Aider Debbie Wilkins explained "The reality is that 12 young people die each week after suffering cardiac arrest. Of these, 270 children will die at school each year. The only definitive treatment for a victim of cardiac arrest is early CPR and defibrillation. This must be administered within 3-5 minutes following collapse to give a fighting chance of survival; making it imperative to have a defibrillator on site. Longdean now has three defibrillators distributed across our new building and we hope this means we are well equipped to offer vital lifesaving assistance if it is ever needed". Head teacher Graham Cunningham expressed the school's gratitude.


