Some of the activities were Educational, Sports, Self -Defense, Cooking, Drug-Awareness, IT Lessons and outings. In total we managed 75 children via 4 organizations. These children were kept busy during summer holidays to keep them away from mischief & crime. As part of this programme, we had a Cricket Tournament on Monday 26th August 2002 to bring together young people. The teams were made up from young people who had successfully worked together as part of the Summer Plus initiatives. The tournament was the finale to celebrate young people's involvement in the summer programme. Our District Governor Mike Baldwin, ZC Vijay Arora, Mayor of Brent Cllr. Abdul Sattur-Butt, President of Lions Club of London Golders Green Shiv Sharma, Officers from Brent Council and many fellow lions attended the Tournament which was a GREAT SUCCESS. I have, in conjunction with Lion Erach Amaria (Peace Poster Officer), started a programme of visits to Clubs and Zones to explain the Scheme, answer queries and offer help and support in the quest for a candidate. The Youth Award is open to young people of 15 and no older than 19 on 1<sup>st</sup> March 2003. It is judged principally on the quality and depth of an individual's community involvement combined with their personality and leadership skills. Bursary prizes are awarded at District and M.D level, which the winning candidates use for the benefit of their chosen community project. The closing date for this Award application is 15<sup>th</sup> December 2002 and the District Final has been arranged for 19<sup>th</sup> January 2003 at the Quality Hotel, Hatfield. The M.D Final takes place in Nottingham on the weekend February 21<sup>st</sup> – 23<sup>rd</sup> 2003. As a District, we usually manage to find 6 to 8 exceptional young people to take part in the Final. Please give the young people of your community the opportunity to take part, learn what motivates our youth and above all encourage and give them your support.
