# World Sight Day - High Wycombe Lions Club

The aim of World Sight Day is to help raise awareness of the need to take action to combat the causes of avoidable blindness and other sight related conditions. World Sight Day is an international campaigning day organised by eye care agencies and Lions Clubs around the world. This year the Lions Club of High Wycombe joined forces with the Pseudoxanthoma Elasticum (PXE) Support Group, headquartered in Marlow, with 430 members nationwide to arrange for PXE members to receive the Support Group's Newsletter on audio cassette. PXE is a progressive disorder that results in the loss of vision in the central part of the eye, leading to the sufferer being registered blind, as well as a range of cardiovascular disorders. To achieve this, the Lions have teamed up with Wycombe Talking Newspapers who had agreed to donate their time to do the actual recordings and duplicate the audio cassettes free of charge. The Lions donated part of the £600 cost of the exercise. Elspeth Lax of the PXE Support Group said, "We are very grateful to both the Lions and Wycombe Talking Newspaper for their support for this project. It will mean a great deal to our members to be able to listen to our annual newsletter rather than having to have it read to them". 


